Like other years, the magazine is released during CABE's annual conference. CABE's 32nd Annual Conference will be held March 6-8th, 2008 at the San Jose McEnery Convention Center. This year's theme is "Bilingual Education: Connecting Cultures, Reclaiming our Future".

- Articles should be no longer than 1,500 to 3,000 words
- Electronic submission in WORD (RTF format preferred) to ana@bilingualeducation.org
- Pictures (jpeg format) supporting articles are encouraged but not required (please note, that submitting pictures does not mean they actually will be included in the magazine).
- Submission of article by October 26th, 2007...NO exceptions. (Please note, that submission does not guarantee that an article will be selected and published).
- Authors will be notified of the review's committee decision by November 30, 2007.
